Students must receive a grade of C- (70%) or above in all HMSV courses, PSYC course, SOCY course, and ECON courses in order to be eligible to apply for the Social Work Assistant (SWA) certificate through the Counselor, Social Worker and Marriage and Family Therapist Board.

Please check with your transfer school of choice regarding the minimum grade required in other courses for transfer eligibility.

Student must make Human and Social Work Services faculty aware of any felonies or misdemeanors currently on record, as this could affect field placement and future employment
