Human Anatomy and Physiology This course is an in-depth study of the principles of human anatomy and physiology. It includes the study of structure and function of the body as a whole and study of cell biology, histology, the integumentary, skeletal, muscular, endocrine, and nervous systems plus the special senses. Laboratory exercises are designed to supplement lecture topics and include microscopy, the study of models, cat and specimen dissection, cadaver study, and physiological experiments. Chemistry Concepts for Human Anatomy & Physiology This course is designed as an introductory course in chemistry for those students who have no previous chemistry background. The focus will be on aspects of chemistry that are essential to understanding Human Physiology. The factor-unit method of problem solving, mathematical operations used in solving chemistry problems, chemical terminology and basic laws of chemistry are covered.
