From the Financial Aid Office

Congratulations to our new COF scholars on choosing to attend NC State and welcome back to our COF veterans. Just a few reminders from the financial aid office...

- COF rules require scholars to maintain a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA.
- Should a scholar's GPA fall to less than 3.0, the scholar is obligated to participate in prescribed tutoring activities.
- Continued poor academic performance will cause a scholarship to be lost
- Scholars must register for and successfully complete at least six credit hours per term.
- You will lose your scholarship if you change your major to one not covered by the scholarship.

We know this must sound *legalistic*, however, financial aid, especially aid provided by a government entity, is all about rules. Please let us know if you have questions about these or about any aspect of the Choose Ohio First scholarship program. Have a great fall semester.
