

## Adjunct Faculty – Business

### NEEDED FOR FALL SEMESTER 2026

North Central State College is seeking adjunct faculty to teach the following in-person courses for Fall semester 2026 (starting 8/17/26).

<p><b>Intro to AI and Business (BUSM 1012)</b></p> <p>This course exposes students to a broad view of the business enterprise. Special emphasis is placed on the role and importance of entrepreneurship and small-business management. Students gain insight into the necessity and mutual interdependence of key business functions, including management, human resources, operations and quality, marketing, accounting, and finance. Additionally, topics of globalization, economics, and the growing role of artificial intelligence in business decision-making and operations are introduced. Throughout the course, students develop problem-solving skills by applying basic business math to typical business scenarios and by exploring how emerging technologies, including AI, can be used to support business analysis, communication, and strategic decision-making.</p>	<p>Sections Available:</p> <p>Richland Correctional Institution Tuesdays &amp; Thursdays 6 PM – 7:15 PM</p>
