## III. Grading and Testing Guidelines:

Grades will follow the college-wide grade scale from the Master Syllabus. Rubrics/Specific requirements will be followed for each assignment or project. Students will know the requirements at the time the assignment is given, so they know the expectations.

Cheating and dishonest practices in connection with examinations, papers, and projects will not be tolerated and are academic misconduct. Including but not limited to using unauthorized notes, study aids or information on an examination, obtaining help from another student during an examination; taking an exam or doing work for another student; this impersonation includes, but is not limited to, taking another person's place for online assignments and testing environments, providing one's own work for another student to copy and submit as his/her own; or allowing another student to do one's work and then submitting the work as one's own. Also included would be altering a graded work after it has been returned, then submitting the work for re-grading; or submitting identical or similar papers for credit in more than one course without prior permission from the course instructors.

#### IV. Examination Policy:

#### V. Class Attendance and Homework Make-Up Policy:

Attendance will be taken in the first 15 minutes of class. Attendance will be adjusted for students arriving late and leaving early.

VCMT Attendance Policy - miss 20% of classes unexcused (6 classes) grade drops 1 letter grade, miss 30% of classes unexcused (9 classes) you will need to repeat the class. Attendance and participation are expected, and 10% of your grade.
