Financial Literacies: FYEX 0070 has partnered with Directions Credit Union. For these assignments, complete modules based off of your lifestyle and/or interests. At the completion of the modules, you will be given a quiz to test your comprehension of the subject. You will upload this quiz as your assignment. The grade you receive on the quiz is what will be used as your assignment grade.

**IV. Examination Policy:**

There will be two 'quizzes' during your first week of the term. The Technology Quiz is a survey geared towards making sure the instructor can identify students that may need additional help as the term begins (such as food needs, tutoring services, laptop and calculator requirements, etc.) The Run, Hide, Fight Quiz is based off the video you will watch.
