I. <u>Topical Timeline (Subject to Change)</u>:

II. <u>Course Assignments</u>:

- 1. Era matching: Homework in the form of terminology matching that are completed at the end of each era (Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and 20th Century) respectively.
- 2. Weekly quizzes as they pertain to the chapter readings.
- 3. Recording review due by the end of the semester, date TBD
 - a. Students are to choose an opera that interests them from the "opera synopsis" section under FILES and seek out a recording or a DVD performance from the library or alternatively find a YouTube of the entire opera with English subtitles to watch. Write a 2-page paper, double-spaced, discussing the composer, the librettist, the synopsis or plot, and what you generally liked or disliked about the opera. Be very specific in your examples used.
 - b. All MUSC 1010 sections must complete the recording review regardless of class/section type.
- 4. Live performance review due by the end of the semester, date TBD
 - a. Students must attend one live musical performance and write a review of that performance. Acceptable concerts include but not limited to: symphony concerts, choral concerts, chamber concerts, student recitals, and jazz concerts. Performances that are not acceptable include: 'pop' concerts or performances that lack substantial musical depth or variety.
 - b. I try my best to secure either complimentary (free) or steeply discounted tickets to area symphony concerts or symphony programs in which I will be performing but I make no guarantee that will happen. Furthermore, you understand that it is your responsibility as the student to fulfill this particular portion of the course requirements should I prove unable to secure complimentary or discounted tickets. Many symphony/choral concerts are free at area colleges.
 - c. In the event of continued COVID-19 measures, students may utilize the apps provided to them by the instructor to fulfill the course requirement.
 - d. All MUSC 1010 sections must complete the live performance review regardless of class/section type.
- 5. Weekly discussion topics
 - a. Some homework assignments may take place in the form of online discussions found on canvas under the 'discussion' tab. It is your responsibility to stay abreast of assignments and due dates. Students must post to the discussion board on a weekly basis as it pertains to that week's module(s). Students should take the utmost care in submitting their discussion posts proofreading them for correct spelling and grammar. Students must submit a minimum of 2 paragraphs for their original post and reply to at least 1 classmate with a minimum paragraph.

I adhere to NC State guidelines regarding administrative withdrawal procedures for non-attendance, non-participation, and lack of engagement. Note: Logging into the course but not completing any work (discussions, quizzes, listening logs etc.) does not constitute as participating. All assigned work is due Sunday of that week by 11:59pm. Please note, once the clock hits 11:59pm any seconds afterward, such as 11:59:25 is considered late. Do not run that close please, budget your time accordingly as I do not give extensions. You may submit work late with a 2.5% deduction per day, please be mindful of accumulating percentages and whether or not completing work weeks after the due date is in your best interest. You are also expected to stay abreast of all canvas announcements and messages, I do not give extensions for missed canvas messages or announcements- set your notifications accordingly.
